


# Thanks for giving your child an opportunity to travel around the world in books this summer!



Print the remaining pages of the PDF. If you want to print back to back, print PDF page 2 with page 3 on the back and page 4 with page 5 on the back. Page 6 gets printed by itself. You can always tape the pages together if you don't want to print back to back.

To make the booklet, place page 3 (Ocean) face down on top of page 2 (North America). When you fold the booklet in half, page numbers should line up.

Staple the booklet together along the spine.

Have your child cut out the book covers on page 6 of the PDF and keep in an envelope or some location where they won't get lost.

As your child finishes reading each book, they should tape or glue the cover image in the proper location.

When your child finishes reading all the books for each location, sit down with him/her (them) to discuss the

questions. The questions are designed to be discussion starters for them to relate things in their lives to what they have read.




# Central & South America
